

Certain vaccinations you may need for travel can be obtained from your GP on a prescription. You will not be charged for these vaccinations.

These vaccinations are:

- Hepatitis A – First and second booster (6-12 months after first dose)
- Combined Hepatitis A and B – All doses
- Typhoid – First and any booster doses
- Combined Hepatitis A and Typhoid (second dose Hep A given as single vaccine)
- Tetanus, Diphtheria and Polio – combined dose
- Cholera

Airthrey Park Medical Centre is a registered Yellow Fever Centre. If you require a yellow fever vaccine then this can be given here. There is a charge for this. The current cost for this vaccine is £50. A certificate will be completed and given to you. This vaccine is also available to members of the public who are not registered with Airthrey Park Medical Centre.

You may be advised that other vaccines are needed for your trip and possibly antimalarials too. If this is the case then the following vaccines need to be given at a private travel clinic:

- Japanese B Encephalitis
- Rabies (Certain groups of people may be eligible for this vaccine to be given free of charge i.e. Bat handlers. Please check with your Doctor or Practice Nurse).
- Meningitis ACWY
- Tickborne Encephalitis
- Hepatitis B (course of single vaccine)
- TB skin test and the BCG vaccine
- Influenza vaccine
- Antimalarials

The cost of these vaccines can vary and we would suggest that you 'shop around'
