



Certain vaccinations you may need for travel can be obtained from your GP on a prescription. You will not be charged for these vaccinations.

These vaccinations are:

- Hepatitis A – First and second booster (6-12 months after first dose)
- Combined Hepatitis A and B – All doses
- Typhoid – First and any booster doses
- Combined Hepatitis A and Typhoid (second close Hep A given as single vaccine)
- Tetanus, Diphtheria and Polio – combined dose
- Cholera

You may be advised that other vaccine are needed for your trip and possibly antimalarials too. If this is the case then the following vaccines need to be given at a private travel clinic:

- Japanese B Encephalitis
- Yellow Fever
- Rabies (Certain groups of people may be eligible for this vaccines to be given free of charge i.e Bat handlers. Please check with your Doctor or Practice Nurse).
- Meningitis ACWY
- Tickborne Encephalitis
- Hepatitis B (course of single vaccine)
- TB skin test and the BCG vaccine
- Influenza vaccine
- Antimalarials

The cost of these vaccines can vary and we would suggest that you ‘shop around’

Please try and give yourself at least 6 – 8 weeks before departure to allow for any courses of vaccines to be given and therefore giving yourself a better level of protection.
